


Hello all, every week the English Team and various adults around school share two reading recommendations for you and your lovely children to read.

Reading Research Alert:

"There is a growing body of evidence which illustrates the importance of reading for pleasure for both educational purposes as well as personal development." Clark and Rumbold, 2006.

Going to the Volcano by Andy Stanton and illustrated by Miguel Ordonez



Dwayne is heading off with Jane to look at the volcano: walking down the Jane-o, riding the Great Dane-o, jumping on the plane-o and flying off to Spain-o! Yet, when they reach the volcano, Dwayne and Jane (and the rest of the volcano-watchers) get a bit of a shock...

This hilarious and anarchic picture book from the author of the Mr Gum series features a brilliant call-and-response format which makes it ideal for reading aloud. It will have children in fits of laughter at Dwayne and Jane's misadventures, and at Andy Stanton's inventive and silly rhyming. This simple but clever format is likely to become a firm favourite with preschoolers, as well as older children who will still appreciate the surreal humour.

The endpapers, naming all the characters in the story, are a joy, as is the brilliantly characterised illustration by Miguel Ordonez, which zings with personality and energy.

SCRAP by Guy Bass and illustrated by Alessia Trunfio



When the humans arrive on Somewhere 513, they discover that the robots sent to prepare the planet for Humanity's arrival have chosen to keep it for themselves. Only one robot remains loyal – KI-NG, aka King of the Robots. But even with the most powerful robot on their side, the outlawed humans don't stand a chance.

Ten years on, Gnat and her sister Paige are the only humans left and have spent their lives hidden underground. Now they must venture out in search of the one robot that stood by the humans. There's just one problem – the once mighty K1-NG has vowed never to help another human for as long as he lives...

This is gripping science fiction for a new generation. Guy Bass takes the idea of robots programmed to serve humanity and extrapolates what might happen when some of them revolt.

Shot through with humour, interspersed with illustrations that could be stills from a film, and brimfull of action, this is a story that zings off the page.We loved the chapter introductions, giving us extracts from 'Memoir of a Mechanical Major', or one of the Fargone Corporation's adverts, or the legally-worded laws ('suggestions') governing robot existence. We loved the characterisation too, especially of Mortem the shovel-bot, as well as the way hearts (and cores) are won over, not by force but by kindness and sacrifice. We very much look forward to reading the next instalment and, meantime, will certainly be recommending this to Year 4 upwards.

95/6 Girls Football

Last Friday, Mr Wynne and Mr Mack took our Year 5/6 girls football squad to a 6-a-side PLAY Cup tournament at Sussex Count HQ in Lancing, and what a fantastic day it was!

We were drawn in a group with 4 other schools from across the county, playing each team twice. Inspired by our star striker Alex, who was supported in attack by Rebeca and Sienna, we managed to score goal after goal to win 5 and draw 2 of our 8 group games - only losing one. It was our defence though, commandingly led by our captain Malaika alongside Jazz, Millie and Ruby, that allowed us to progress easily into the knock-out stage. So strong was our defensive organisation that Olivia and Chelsea, taking it in turns in goal, had little to do but made important saves when called upon. Both girls also contributed when playing in attack, which demonstrates the fantastic team spirit and togetherness the girls displayed throughout the day.

Sadly our superb run ended in the semi-final against a very strong, and eventual winners, Carden, but that did little to dampen the girls' mood after a wonderful day of sport!
